# Planning Report and Levelling Up Money

Nigel Millar spoke to his report, including a recent A&B report on affordable housing detailing future possibilities for development, and questioned newspaper reports of £20 million "levelling up" money apparently allocated to A&B.

#### Pier

Anne Foy reported from Helensburgh Pier Extension Project following recent Stantec report questioning economic viability. HPEP continues to believe there is a way forward to an operational pier and are talking to A&B. A&B have proposed to discuss asset transfer of pier to the community. This evidently involves consideration of current state of repair, future maintenance funding, insurance, liability etc. Agreed that all the groups involved with the pier will work together.

#### Waterfront

Peter Brown reported current state of the bid as ready to submit for December 6<sup>th</sup>. More than 20 Helensburgh residents had worked on the document, and it captured the breadth of expertise in the town, building on the work from Vision for Helensburgh and our recent survey work.
