## Minutes of Last Meeting

Discussed and approved.

## Police Report

In person report presented and discussed.10 new CCTV cameras being installed in various antisocial hotspots around the town.

### Helensburgh Fire Station

Presentation regarding the downgrade of the fire station. Discussed were cuts to the service including 23 changes to staffing levels across Scotland. Helensburgh station proposed working hours being Monday to Friday 8am-6pm resulting in increasing response times, increased risk to public and firefighters. Also discussed was the risk to safety and new technologies i.e. electric cars and lithium battery. Lack of funding. New housing developments, wider risks or climate change and flooding, tourist population and road traffic. The consultation runs to 16th September. HFS asks that people take part in the online consultation savesf.com, Jackie Baillie's constituency petition form.jotform.com, HFS's change.org petition. HCC proposed and supported a motion opposing the changes.

# Introductions and Questions from the public

HCC and A&B Councillors introduced.

#### Questions from the public:

Pier out of action and toilets still not working and more autonomy for towns like Helensburgh from A&B council.

Bins regularly overflowing at Kidston point. Encouraged to lodge request with the council on their website.

Post on Scotland's Scenery Facebook page praising the recycling centre.

Asked why the scaffolding at the leisure centre is not up as promised. The scaffolding will be expected in the next 2 weeks.

Public concern on the need to keep track of the action points and A&B council and Lomond Area Committee and concern over health and safety regarding the playground of Hermitage primary despite being a 'flagship' school.

#### Pharmacy update

Pharmacy application has been pushed back again, HCC members, Cameron and Elizabeth will attend the online hearing on 3<sup>rd</sup> September.
